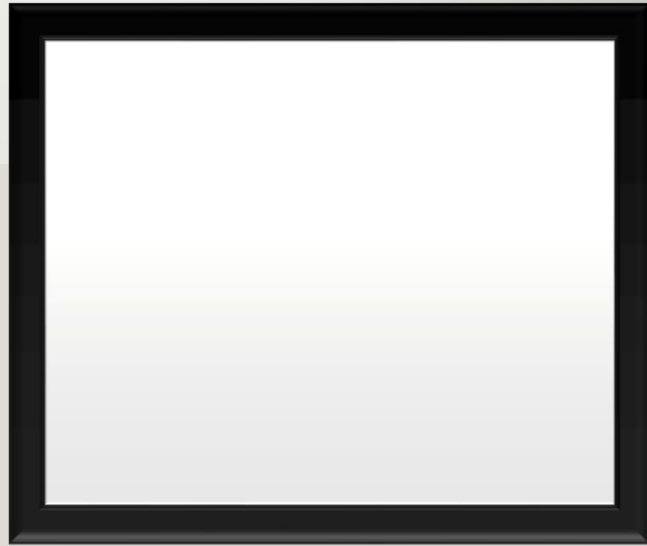

IMPORTANCE OF FATHER & MALE ROLE MODEL ENGAGEMENT

- Evidence demonstrates that fathers play a critical role in children's health and development, beginning in the prenatal period and continuing through early childhood and adolescence. When fathers are involved during pregnancy, mothers **are 1.5 times more likely** to receive prenatal care in the first trimester. ~ National Institute of Children's Health Quality (NICHQ)

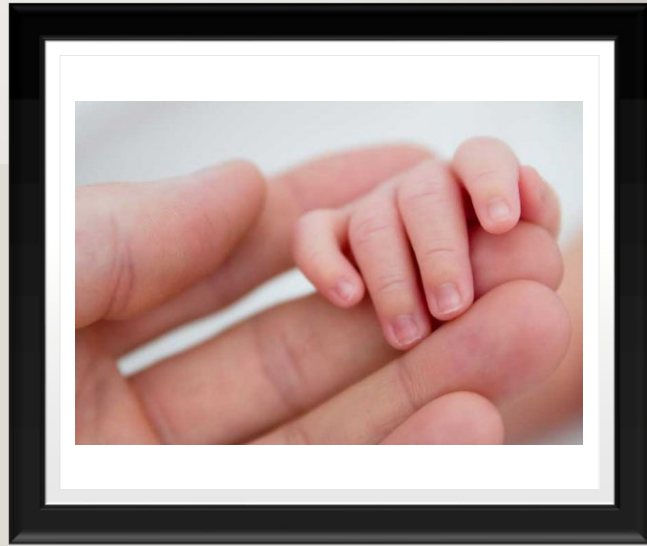

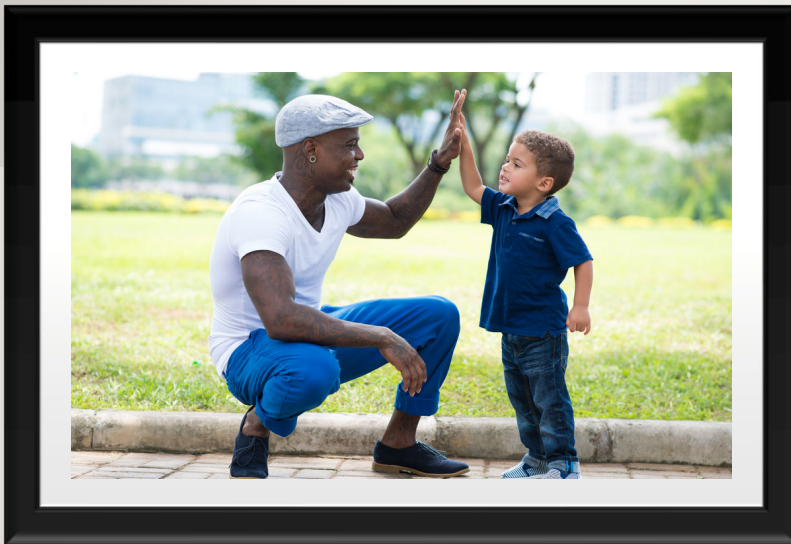
